District-wide, students benefited from the computer programs "Brain Pop" and "Enchanted Learning" thanks to the efforts of Marcia Adams, Lisa McNamara and Rachel Zalocha. Specialists Freea Leahy, Lawrie Donovan and Judith Scarpelli worked towards "The Stress-Free Student" in Kindergarten-Grade12.

All students in preschool through Grade 8 were "Eyeing for iPads" thanks to Kristin Butler, Brenda Elfman, Ruth Ann LoSciuto, Erin O'Duggan, Paula Pelissier and Margaret Wagner.

All Kindergarten through Grade 5 students were the recipients of many grant programs.

Special Education teachers *Erin*O'Duggan and Jennifer Roback introduced
"News 2 You" and the "Unique Learning
System," and they also received a grant for
"iPad apps for Education." School psychologists
Emily Kidd and Lisa Whelan "Integrated
Technology Into Social Skills Instruction"
and they, along with Erin O'Duggan and
Special Education teacher Meghan Byrne
used "Michelle Garcia Winner's Social
Thinking" while working with their students in
Kindergarten through Grade 5.

Jefferson School students were "Reaching for the Stars Through Reading" thanks to Grade 4 teacher *Jean Page*. Also at Jefferson School, *Marian Camirand* and *Wendy Savage-Caprio* were able to implement the program "Turn, Talk, Teach" to enhance their Grade 1 students' learning.

At the Esten School, Principal *Carol McGrath* invited a "Poet in Residence" to the school to work with fourth grade students. *Mrs. McGrath* also brought "Global Education" to those students in Grades 1-5 with the painting of a world map on the Esten School playground.



Kathleen Ferry, Grade 2 teacher, facilitated in-house field trips for her students. She brought the "Birds of Prey" and "Amphibians and Reptiles" to all second graders at Esten School via the Blue Hills Trailside Museum, and Grade 2 students also learned through hands-on demonstrations about "Fossils and Dinosaurs with Walter Schell." Mrs. Ferry also received a grant for "Daily Literacy Tools," which she again shared with all Esten School second graders. Teacher *Linda McFarland* provided Reading Eggs by Study Island" to Grade 1 and EPASS students at Esten School, and Grade 4 teachers Karen Duffey, Diane Hayes, Melinda **Learning** and **Susan Wells** "Empowered Students Through Written Expression" as a result of their grant award.
